1

Make your passwords long...*not complicated*

Use a phrase or a few random words
strung together in a way you can easily
remember them.

Make it **15+ characters** in length.

Example*: I-70trafficistheworst!

**please make up your own, though*

For the love of everything good on this Earth:

*Don't use the same password
for multiple accounts*

It's easy, sure, but if one account is
compromised, then you can assume
every other account with that same
password is as well.

Consider using a password manager

We get it - you have a million
passwords to remember.

Use a password manager, like
LastPass, to securely store your
passwords.

But **make sure you use 2FA!**

What is 2FA you ask?

Enabling 2-Factor Authorization,
or 2FA, is one of the best things you
can do to protect your account.

In addition to your account password,
you enter in a secondary form of
identification.

This can be a code sent via text, an
authentication app-generated code,
yubikey, etc.
